

2008 Gorman Heritage Farm Raffle Quilt

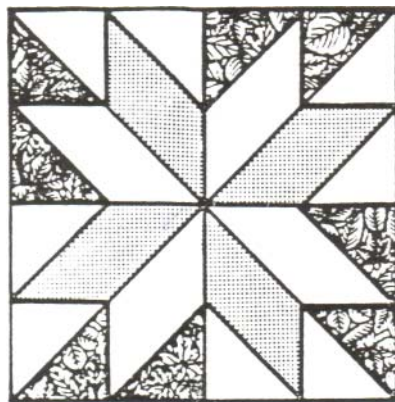
Gorman Heritage Farm Quilters have chosen a pattern for the 2008 raffle quilt that was originally designed for Ohio's Bicentennial celebration in 2003. It uses very traditional blocks, such as stars, baskets, log cabin and its many variations, churn dash, flying geese, nine patches, houses, barns, trees, the schoolhouse, Jacob's ladder and any other block that you think will fit with an antique theme.

The GHF Quilters and guest quilters should make a traditional block of your choice in 18th and 19th century reproduction fabrics. (The Civil War collections are the most popular and easiest to find.)

Your finished block size when returned to GHF should measure in even number increments such as $6\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$, $8\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$, $12\frac{1}{2} \times 12\frac{1}{2}$ or rectangle blocks $4\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$, $2\frac{1}{2} \times 14\frac{1}{2}$, etc.

Return to GHF by January 15, 2008 and GHF Quilters will arrange the blocks in a pleasing design and fill in where necessary to create a patriotic themed quilt that has the appearance of a very old quilt.
